Latest news from the WEICON family

First WEICON TOOLS conference







The search engine for our adhesives has now been translated into many languages and is available in the following versions: German, Chinese, English, French, Icelandic, Italian, Polish, Romanian, Russian, Slovakian, Spanish, Czech, Turkish and (coming soon) Portuguese.

This means that customers in almost any country on Earth can search for our adhesives in their own language – from the Arctic to Australia!





WEICONLOCK marking-free

All in all, the WEICON product family now consists of more than 40 types for different applications in a huge range of industrial fields.

Health protection and safety at work

Health protection and safety at work is becoming an ever-greater priority in many of these fields.

Products and auxiliaries have to adhere to strict guidelines and meet the requirements of company medical officers. Staff who come into contact with these substances need to be protected and to be able to do their jobs without limitation.

In order to achieve this, we have developed special WEICONLOCK types that meet these high standards and at the same time display the required product properties.

Marking-free label types

These products do not have to be labelled with hazard symbols in accordance with the directive (EC) 1272/2008 (GHS/CLP).

Some types also possess an approval from the National Sanitation Foundation (NSF). These properties make them especially suitable for the food, drinking water, cosmetics and pharmaceutical industry, although they can be used for securing, fastening and sealing in absolutely any segment.

Using marking-free WEICONLOCK products ensures adherence to the provisions for better safety at work, improves health protection and exploits the many product benefits of these anaerobic adhesives and sealants.











WEICONLOCK for high-alloy steel and other passive materials

WEICONLOCK products are onecomponent, anaerobic adhesives and sealants. The different types in the WEICONLOCK product family can be used for thread locking, retaining cylindrical assemblies, sealing of threaded pipes and fittings or flange sealing and gasketing.

The various types differ in their viscosity, i.e. their different flow properties, the maximum gap bridging, their hardness, their colour and their individual temperature resistance.

All WEICONLOCK products are resistant to temperature fluctuations, chemicals and solvents, and display very high vibration and impact resistance.

Active and passive materials

When it comes to surfaces to be adhered, it is important to distinguish between active and passive materials.

Active materials are essentially metals with a high iron or copper content, such as iron, steel, copper or brass.

These materials are able to emit a large number of metal particles, ensuring that the anaerobic adhesive hardens very quickly while deprived of air.

When oxygen from the air is excluded, the hardening process is initiated very quickly due to the effect of metal particles on the surface of the material. In contrast, passive materials such as high-alloy steel (stainless steel), zinc, aluminium and plastics can only emit a small number of metal ions, or even none at all. This means that anaerobic adhesives usually harden only very slowly on these materials, or only with the help of an activator.

Fast and extremely strong joints even without activators

Especially for use on passive materials, we have developed a few special types that are able to harden fully on these problematic materials and to connect the joining parts quickly and extremely strongly, even without the use of an activator.

This means no loss of strength! The positive properties, such as vibration strength and high temperature resistance, are fully retained even when the adhesive is used on passive materials.





WEICON helps the Regenbogenschule

No more holes

In June, we received an enquiry of a very special kind.

The Regenbogenschule in Muenster-Kinderhaus (LWL special school for physical and motoric development) wanted our help. The school's bouncy castle had holes in it and the children in the first year were in danger of missing out on their sport lessons.

Two of the teachers at the school had the idea of asking us whether there was an adhesive that could be used to repair the bouncy castle. Without any hesitation, two of our staff visited the Regenbogenschule and sealed the holes with the new rubbermetal adhesive GMK 2510 and a few pieces of truck tarpaulin.

"We are very happy that WEICON was able to help us so spontaneously. The bouncy castle is now totally leak-proof again and our youngest students can use it for their sport lessons," said Helmut Hamsen, Head of the Regenbogenschule.

Language is the key

"There are a lot of people who suffer from war or persecution in their home countries. Many families try to escape this situation and look to us to provide protection and safety. But we did not want to donate the money to a large organisation, as it is difficult to see where the money really goes and what it is ultimately used for. So we looked right on our doorstep and entered cooperation with the community of Havixbeck. They were delighted with

our donation and found the perfect use for it right away – paying for language courses," says Ralph Weidling on the reasons behind the donation.

"The key to really getting off to a good start in a new country and being able to integrate is the language. We are also so happy to be able to use the funds from WEICON to offer German courses for many refugees," said Monika Böse, Head of Department in the administration in Havixbeck, on how the money will be used.

Competition for rescue services in the heart of Romania

Effective, reliable, high-performing – WEICON is the new partner of the Romanian rescue service SMURD.

The end of September saw a competition in Romania among the country's rescue services. Large numbers of units from all over Romania competed against one another in the town of Targu Mures. One of the challenges was to save people from a wrecked vehicle as quickly as possible.

And of course, a product and information stand from WEICON was an essential part of the rescue services competition in Romania. Why? - As the new sponsor and therefore important partner of the SMURD rescue team, WEICON Romania has been equipping the emergency vehicles with maintenance products and the sprayable traction aid Power Grip since this year, ensuring optimum traction for the tyres even in difficult driving conditions during the Romanian winter.

After all, reaching a rescue site quickly and safely even in bad weather is the most important thing for rescue services – not only in Romania.

Speed was of the essence in the competition, too. The teams had to simulate a rescue from a wrecked vehicle in a re-enactment of an accident scene. The group that was able to get everybody out in the shortest time was the winner. In the end, however, everyone was a winner, as the Romanian rescuers are known as the best in Eastern Europe, despite having only existed for a relatively short time. It was only in 1990 that Raed Arafat, a Palestinian medical student, founded the "mobile service for emergencies, resuscitation and rescue", SMURD for short, in Romania.



Since then, the service has developed over the years and now saves many lives in Romania every day.

"We are very proud to be able to support the Romanian rescue service in its incredible work with our WEICON products," reports Alexandru Vlaicu, Branch Manager of WEICON Romania.




The large number of companies visited was intended to give the magazine's readers an idea of the African economy, which has seen extremely strong growth in recent years.


Thanks to him, we are succeeding in increasing the profile of WEICON in Africa little by little and establishing ourselves on this interesting market for the long term.




































Complex filming at WEICON



WEICON receives training at Lake Constance

Plastic Metal BL processed in seconds

In June, a large number of our colleagues travelled to the company Wagner at Lake Constance to take part in a product training course.

Wagner is one of the world's leading producers of devices and plants for surface finishing with paints, powder coatings, wet coatings and other liquid materials.

The company produces these spray systems for both trade and industry, as well as offering good-value starter products for ambitious DIY enthusiasts, which are sold in DIY stores.

An international team

The event was to include testing the processing of the Plastic Metal BL with a spray system.

The use of the Wagner systems is intended to allow even, repeatable coating in a user-friendly time.

As well as staff from Sales, Product Management and Advertising in Muenster, various sales representatives, a team from WEICON Safarik in the Czech Republic and a colleague from WEICON Romania also took part in the training – a very international group!

The Czech Republic is home to many companies active in the coatings sector, so our colleagues from the Czech Republic were of course very interested in finding out more about the easy processing of Plastic Metal BL at the training course.













Theory and practice

The training began with a theoretical part, in which our colleagues were introduced to the Wagner company and the different products it offers.

They then moved straight on to the practical part of the training, in which





handling a spray system using WEICON Plastic Metal BL was tested.

The aim of the test series was to find out whether we can recommend Wagner devices for processing the Plastic Metal type BL to our customers in future, in order to achieve the best possible application results.

WEICON and Wagner – a great combination





We already have the first result of the test series: this kind of processing is especially suitable for largearea coatings and industrial series production, as the use of the spray system enables a greater layer thickness.

The other results of the practical trials will now be intensively analysed and edited.





Visiting a longboard builder

Boards for the world

Christopher Earl is a hands-on kind of guy. The 30-year-old from Bielefeld is a trained carpenter and a passionate longboard rider, so he knows all there is to know about wood and how to work with it. So why not bring his hobby and his job together?

This initial reverie since turned into the small company Donkey Architect's Longboarding.

Production by customer order

Alongside a few standard versions for various uses, the creative genius also works together with his customers to produce custom-made boards – one-of-a-kind pieces tailored exactly to what the buyer wants. Not many people can say that they do their laps on an individual board that is absolutely unique in the world.



Be it the shape or design, everything can be tailored exactly to the customer's requirements – "there are practically no limits," says Christopher Earl.

Producing a board

Adhesives play a crucial role in the production of his boards. After all, it is they that make it possible to bind together the various layers that make up the decks.

The deck is the board on which the rider stands. A deck usually consists of seven wafer-thin layers of wood, which need to be joined together.

Earl uses birch boards for his decks. They are painted with an epoxy resin system and then clamped into a press – developed by himself – together with fibreglass mats for 24 hours. The

fibreglass mats increase the stability of the boards, which are subjected to significant forces in their everyday use. It is then time for the fine work. The blanks are formed into the desired shape using a jigsaw and then sanded. Holes are then drilled to allow the wheels to be attached under the deck. Once these mechanical steps are complete, various tests are conducted to examine the riding properties, before the longboard is demounted once again. The final step is to apply the design to the underside of the deck and varnish over it. The board can then be completely reassembled.

The completely handmade unique piece









is finished – ready to ride the world's streets and slopes!

WEICON Casting Resin MS 1000

The two-component epoxy resin adhesives used in the board construction

consist of a resin and a hardener system. Epoxy resin adhesives display very high strength and chemical resistance.

WEICON Casting Resin MS 1000 is suitable for a wide range of applications, such as adhering the shown wood layers to fibreglass mats, or as a sealing compound, for example for electrical components.

The casting resin can be used in many industrial segments, such as the electrical industry and mechanical engineering.

Training for fire protection volunteers

Just in case

In September, 14 colleagues in Muenster received a training as fire protection volunteers.

This means that around ten per cent of WEICON staff are now equipped to deal with an emergency – an excellent figure!

Instruction in theory and practice

The instruction was provided by one of WEICON's fire protection officers. The colleagues were first trained in theoretical aspects, such as the basics of fire protection, how fire extinguishing equipment works and how to behave in the case of fire.

The afternoon saw them move on to practical exercises, such as how to handle fire extinguishing equipment, extinguishing tactics and company-specific features at WEICON, such as fires in electrical systems or hazardous goods.

These practical applications took the participants all over the WEICON site, being taught about the different fire protection systems at WEICON, such as the emergency call centre, wall hydrants and mobile extinguishing equipment, and how to use them.

"All the colleagues did very well and can now call themselves WEICON fire protection volunteers.



Of course, they enjoyed handling the fire extinguishers and wall hydrant the most. A lot of them were very impressed with how strong the water pressure in the hydrant is, and how effectively they would be able to fight fires even from a great distance with them," said fire protection officer Norbert Kockmann after the training.

Modified Formulation

WEICON Repair Stick Titanium

15 years ago WEICON developed the top product of our Repair Stick range, which includes 9 different types overall, WEICON Repair Stick Titanium.

Given the revised requirements of REACH and GHS / CLP, the existing formulation had to be adjusted by replacing and reducing various ingredients.

We managed, by modifying resin and hardener, to further improve the excellent properties of the product, which is especially suitable for high temperature applications. The new formulation is already visible by the new colour scheme of the sticks.

Further advantages result through these enhancements. We have succeeded to reduce the labelling of hazardous substances and the workplace exposure significantly, thus making the new sticks considerably more user-friendly.



Technically, the new formulation offers highly improved values regarding impact and tensile shear strength. We also now have a shorter pot life and curing speed.

The table shows the advantages of the new stick compared to the old formulation.

Vespa Rally 2015

An impressive backdrop

In late August, Tyrol in Austria played host to the Tre Giorni – a rally with classic Vespa scooters – for the second time. WEICON was also part of the line-up for this extraordinary race!

Norman Otto, one of our colleagues from the Export department and an enthusiastic Vespa driver himself, registered a five-person team from Muenster for this year's event.

A total of 210 participants from all over Europe took part in the rally.

They were divided into categories based on the engine capacity of the cult

The rally was not all about speed – the winner was the driver who managed to collect the lowest number of penalty points across the three stages. Each starter was given a personal arrival time, when he was supposed to reach the finish line.

They were given one penalty point for each 1/100 second difference between the target and actual arrival time. Further penalty points were given for failure to answer questions posed on each stage.

The Tre Giorni was held in Tyrol, on mountains between 2,000 and 3,000 metres high.

The stages

The rally was divided into three stages, completed over three days. The first round took the drivers to the Brandenberg Valley, where the origin of the Brandenberger Ache river was explored. The route continued






via an eight-kilometre gravel path to the Achensee lake, from where the competitors returned to Innsbruck.

The second stage involved covering a distance of 250 kilometres and a total of 5,000 metres in height. The route led over the Brennerpass (1,374 metres), the Jaufenpass (2,094 metres), the Timmelsjoch (2,474 metres) and Kühtai (2,017 metres).

The final stage took the competitors to the Mieminger Plateau, on to Tarenz and back to Innsbruck.
